1	Prof. Orla Feely, UCD Vice-President for Research, Innovation and Impact, and President of Engineers Ireland, gave the welcome words on behalf of NovaUCD.			
2	Our Section Chair, Izzet Kale, gave a short welcome address to attendees and thanked everyone that joined the Autumn meeting in person and via Zoom.			
3	EA reported on apologies for non-attendance.			
4	Minutes of the 29 th April 2022 Spring CC meeting and AGM were proposed for to approval. EA highlighted the actions on the minutes checking their status and resolution. The meeting minutes were unanimously approved by ExCom.			
5	Oral Reports (~5 min) on Chapters key achievements, current plans and focus areas 2023 including goals, KPIs, challenges, and resources. All Chapter Chairs presented based on their report submissions using the one-page slide template. 6	 LC gave the attendees a summary of the L31 Submissions Guide and Deadlines. Two L31 reports per year, including attendance information 3rd Friday in February deadline, additional 10% bonus to the total rebate. Six or more meetings (and reporting by above deadline) shall receive an additional US\$75. A Chapter or Affinity Group to be placed on probation if reports are not submitted for two consecutive years and dissolved after three years of inactivity. The hard deadline is the 15th March to avoid probation. New Categories: Professional, Non-Technical, Humanitarian, Pre-U STEM. Only technical activities will qualify the chapter for rebate. LC also reminded attendees to ensure the correct chairperson is registered on IEEE vTools. He suggested to add executive committee to the roster, for access to OU Analytics and vTools Events. 			
7	Following up what was discussed in the Spring Meeting, IK highlighted the importance of renewing leadership for those Chapters which Chairs have been on the role for many years. LC will request on behalf of IK that all Chapters create a succession plan to understand when the leadership will be transferred and how. IK explained that Vice-Chairs should be the next Chairs so every chapter should appoint a Vice-Chair knowing this person will become the next Chair, with assured continuity. IK also requested that not only chapter chairs create succession plans, but all colleagues on ExCom and other positions in the Section do the same.	1	LC and IK will contact chapter chairs to discuss succession plans. 8	IK mentioned that the 8th edition of the RTSI 2023 conference will be hosted by the UK and Ireland Section (originally agreed to 2022 moved due to COVID). The RTSI (Research and Technologies for Society and Industry) forum has been the flagship conference of the IEEE Italy Section for 6 years. The seventh edition 2022, was organized by the French Section. IK explained that originally R8 claimed 30% of the RTSI conference profits, but now this number was negotiated and set at 5%.	2	IK will check the option for booking the RTSI 2023 for first week of September at University of Cambridge with the implications

	The conference usually takes place in the last week of August, but it was agreed that the first week of September would be a better time to hold the conference, as the whole of Europe is on holidays during August and the first week of September the universities have not yet started its activities formally. IK is having discussions with Cambridge University to host the conference there thinking also in all the industries located nearby. MG mentioned that Italy organisation was very different than the French one. Italy used to bring around 400 attendees with important industry presence. The French edition has around 60 attendees reducing considerably the size of the event. MG also mentioned that Italy editions brought together different societies which was a key factor and UK and Ireland should do the same. IK mentioned that he wants as many of our Chapters as possible to be involved so we can split the technical committees and work as collaboratively as possible within each area of interest.	3	The size of the conference will probably be similar to the French edition (~60 -100 attendees?)
