Overview of current plan and activities:	 iMilestones expected to be dedicated in 2024: a) The Cavity Magnetron (Peter Grant, Edinburgh; Contact with Birmingham, Rod Muttram): This has now been approved by the History Committee and the IEEE Board of Directors. Birmingham University has responded positively and nominated a small committee to work with us on the dedication. A first meeting with them is scheduled for 26/10/2023. Peter Grant has suggested a seminar program which looks suitable. Likely ceremony date April/May/June 2024 b) The Anderson Bridge (Gerard Hurley, PELS, Galway) complete, submitted and still awaiting an Advocate. Note: Advocates must be a past or present History Committee member – there are currently 21 proposals awaiting an Advocate. Should we challenge this condition? iiFinalise and submit proposal for LEO (Lyons Electronic Office, London) Milestone (Brian Harrington, Charles Turner, LEO Computer Society). Plaque to be at the Queen's Head pub where the team met. Agreement letter signed. Visit planned to agree final position. Proposal delayed by Brian Harrington's computer problems but 90% complete. Historical accuracy and experts to be checked with Leo Computer Society before submission. iiiInvestigate with IET possibility of joint Milestone at Savoy Hill House for first commercial transatlantic broadcast (BRH) – still trying to secure a plaque site following rejection by the Savoy Hotel. ivTo progress the search for a partner organisation to enable the IEEE UK and Ireland Section to offer its members Professional Registration and to improve industrial relationships. Following the positive meeting between Rod Muttram and Chair Izzet Kale and the IET Izzet has been attempting to move things forward with IEEE HQ, Izzet to report at meeting.
